Extract from Chairman's Annual Report for 2017/2018

Planning

Planning applications have been particularly light with no large or controversial schemes this year. We have been pleased to see the sale of the St John Inn go through this year. This has been welcomed by the village; the new owners have had a great deal of local support. The Parish Council hopes that the Inn will continue to prosper, and did not object to the ownership of the cottage being separated from that of the Inn

Environment

It is becoming evident that spending cuts are increasingly affecting the environmental services provided by Cornwall County. It has been difficult to get the actions requested by us, particularly in respect of highways and drainage.

We have had some success with signage improvements in St John village but have had to agree to fund further improvements ourselves. In the current economic climate the PC will be forced to spend more itself on environmental improvements.

We have had some potholes filled but await detailed survey on the drainage deficiencies on the main road past Mark's cottage.

We have continued to liaise with both the Cornwall Wildlife Trust and the Woodland Trust in respect of woodland management and access improvements to Benskin's Wood. We have funded materials for new access steps down by the ford and the work was undertaken by willing volunteers.

We have been delighted with our new Clerk's approach and efficiency, particularly with improved documentation and accounting.

"to provide and maintain the St John Village Hall and field for the use of the inhabitants of the village and parish of St. John, Torpoint in the County of Cornwall for the benefit without distinction of political religious or other opinions including the use for lectures and classes and for other forms of recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants"

Those of you who came to the Village Hall AGM last month will have heard us explain how it is intended to manage the Charity and there are a few formal matters that we need to do.

So the first PUBLIC MEETING of the Charity will take place on MONDAY 18th June at 7:00pm. At this meeting the new Trustees (who were nominated at the Hall AGM in April) need to be officially voted onto the board.

Having been thwarted at Minions in March by atrocious weather, nineteen St John Walkers set off for a re-match with the elements and the area.



Spotlight



My second guest in the 'spotlight' is June Barrie who describes herself as Half Hampshire Hog / Half Lincolnshire Yellow Belly!









June was born in Twickenham in 1928 and, as her Father was a bank manager, the family moved extensively around the country approximately every 2 years.

She always had a love of horses and although she desperately wanted to work with them this was not really approved of by her family and so, after leaving school at 17, she did a various jobs and eventually joined the Wrens.

She would have worked as a bomb range assessor but being, by her own admission, not very good at trigonometry, worked instead in the victualing supply office in Reading, becoming a leading Wren (although she says this was probably mostly due to her badminton skills!).

It was during this period that she met her future husband who was a schoolmaster in the Navy.

Leaving the service after three years June worked as a hotel receptionist in Keswick in the Lake District and on her days off developed her love of walking in the beautiful lakeland countryside. She has also worked in Market research, in and around the Liskeard and Tavistock areas, getting an interesting overview of consumers' wants, needs and beliefs.

Due to Naval postings June and her family have lived in Malta, Gibraltar, Scotland and Australia, with postings in between at Fisguard and a final posting to HMS Raleigh in 1969, resulting in the families moving into Mendennick Cottage in St John.

Wherever June has lived she has managed (by fair means or foul!) to have her own horse. 'A horse in every port' she says... She needed a trailer for her horse and so worked for the Green Shield Stamp Company until she had saved enough money to buy one.

She has also enjoyed riding and fox hunting with the East Cornwall Hunt. Her last beloved horse being 'Mr. McKenzie', who sadly had to be put down in 1997.

Nowadays June is more known to us as a prolific Labrador dog owner, breeder and trainer. She started as a 'beater' and trained her first gun dog (Ebony) in 1970. Since then many dogs have benefitted from her gun dog training skills, which were all learnt from an old book!

Apart from attending shoots with her dogs – she currently attends shoots on Lord Rowborough's estate at Maristow - she has also had success in Gun Dog Tests, winning several cups.

June has a daughter in Ireland, a son in Spain and a son in Yorkshire as well as 6 grandchildren. She enjoys gardening, doing the Telegraph crossword, playing the odd game of Boules and, of course, walking with her dogs, staying positive and very fit.

She has said that she is not looking forward to her forthcoming birthday celebrations, part of which is a celebratory cream tea to be put on by the West Dartmoor Gun Dog Club.

I suspect she will have a "bone to pick with them" as she doesn't want any fuss!
