We have heard from the Boundary Commission that the new Cornwall County Ward will comprise the five parishes on the Rame Peninsula plus the parish of St Germans, and a small area of Torpoint. Consequently our Ward will remain very predominantly rural, which is the outcome that we were seeking.

We have now had our new "Restricted Access" road signs erected at the northern route into the village from the Trevol junction and this should make it much clearer for HGVs attempting to cut through the village. We are pleased to see that after our longstanding requests the white lines and speed signs have been repainted throughout the village.

You may be pleased to hear that Sharrow Beach is now open again following cliff stabilization that has now been carried out to ensure safety against rock falls.

Many of you will be aware that the Peninsula Trust has succeeded in raising their target funds for the development of the Ship in Cawsand.
