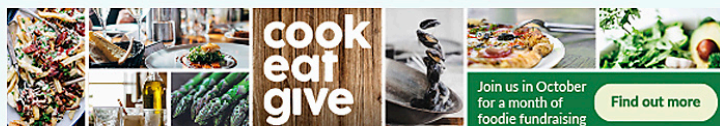
Lydia Hinton & Sam Hunt - Looe Island
