#### Latest News from the Trustees



We met on the 16th of September for our quarterly meeting and amongst the many items discussed were:

- The Land Registry has completed the registration of the Hall and Field with the St John Village Trust.
- Following attendance at a seminar for Village Halls, we have been able to obtain new dedicated insurance at a significant saving.
- Whilst the St John Inn kindly keeps an eye on the defibrillator it is the responsibility of the Trust to check and maintain – a volunteer is needed to liase with the pub.
- Fund raising for this financial year is on target for our budget.
- Health and Safety Review is complete and planned action in place.
- Terms and Conditions for the use of the Hall and Field to be displayed within the Hall.
- Plans for 75th anniversary of VE day to be considered.

The application for the National Lottery grant has now moved on to the second stage needed to enable the bid to be put forward to be considered. This requires a Consultation Process and detailed Project Management Plan. Trustees have agreed to seek a Funding Grant which is available to cover this. Chris Morris has been to Tipton-St.John and Sheviock which have both recently been successful in obtaining Lottery Funding and received some valuable guidance.

The "Community" Work-In on Saturday 21st was a great success. Well done Christian for coordinating our efforts and thanks to the 12 who turned up with hammers, paintbrushes, cloths and ladders. It was so good to see everyone enjoying a bit of banter whilst repainting the outside of the Hall. Thanks too to Emma and Albert for bringing the cake and making the tea/coffee.




