30.21 Apologies for absence. Cllr Tanner

**31.21** Declarations of interest relating to items on the agenda.

Ben Crane recused himself from the decision re: Beverley chalet Planning application PA21/05788.

**32.21** Discussion re: application to Cornwall Council for a £3,000 bus shelter grant to replace the Freathy Bus Shelter.

Hopefully Freathy Mgt company may make a contribution to the new bus shelter and dismantle and remove the old shelter.

Proposed : Cllr Hirst Seconded: Cllr Everard

Councillors agreed a budget allocation of expenditure £ 4,865.

Councillors agreed Budget increase income by £3,000.

**Action:** Once the grant has been approved by CC the Clerk has the authority to order the new bus shelter.

## 33.21 Yellow lines at Freathy.

Cormac had tarmacked over the yellow lines at Freathy in June. Cllr Hoskin contacted highways and they have been reinstated by Will Glassup.

**Action:** Clerk to contact him and thank him for his swift action.

- **34.21** Councillor Richards attended a Cluster meeting organised by County Cllr Ewert and updated the councillors on the topics discussed.
  - Rame circulatory system is now obsolete. There will be road improvements in Antony and Crafthole instead.
  - Hounster Hill, Millbrook feasibility study is due to commence.
  - Recycling centre at Trevol.
  - Openreach/ government funded high speed internet scheme.

**Action:** Clerk to see what provider Antony is dealing with.

- Swimming pool for Torpoint feasibility study is due to commence.
- **35.21** Cllr Hoskin updated the members on the Enforcement training he undertook and the Gateway Cluster meeting he attended.
  - New clearway disc signs to be erected on Military road.
  - Each enforcement officer has 180 cases to deal with per year so many cases are not addressed.

## 36.21 Replace wildlife signage at the Ford in St John.

Cllr Everard has been looking into replacing the old information signs at the Ford in St John. Approx cost £1,000.

Cllr Ewert has a community chest fund of £3,000.

Action: Clerk to apply for £500 matched funding for the sign.

Cllr Everard would like to enhance this wildlife area.

Action: Clerk to apply to Antony Estate for an application form for discretionary fund.

**PA21/06106.** Maker view Councillors felt that this application was inappropriate as it should be demolition and rebuild not a reroofing and recladding. Objection.

It appears that the footprint is no larger than original chalet but the ridge height appears to contravene Article 4 guidance at 400mm.
