Once on the brink of national extinction, **Red Kites** with their distinctive forked tail and reddish colouration are finally here on the Rame! One was spotted on Monday 23rd May (C.Dale). Further down the county, near Penzance a **Montagu's Harrier** is exciting birdwatchers. And a stunning **Roller** on the Clowance estate and even an Egyptian Vulture at Devoran.

Extract from PC Annual Report for 2021/2022



Well, I suppose the most important thing that happened this year was the Election in May, and I have been delighted to welcome John Tanner and Ben Crane, as new councillors for St John and Tregonhawke respectively. John and Ben are already making significant contributions to parish matters. Democracy worked in May, even though the £1500 which we had to pay Cornwall Council was a surprisingly higher amount that anticipated.

Arranged new signage for Tregonhawke Contracted Green Thumb to improve grass at memorial garden.

Investigated improvements to the "turning area" by the ford, including liaison with Wildlife Trust*. Repaired 16th century tomb gravestone in our churchyard.

Directed solar fund to new windows in St John VH, Freathy Sports Club and new lighting to illuminate our church tower*.

Finance

We have continued to manage our finances prudently but various increasing costs have meant that after many years of not increasing the Council Tax precept, we have this year found it necessary to increase parishioners' contributions. This will provide a solid buffer to increasing costs and challenges, including new election costs provision.

Memorial Garden

Our only property responsibility is the memorial garden in St John, and we have continued to maintain this through gardening and stone cleaning, and I would like to again thank Cllr Everard for his special efforts in this regard. Our Christmas Tree will now continue to be supplemented by our new floodlights illuminating the church tower*. (We are planning some further enhancements for the Royal Jubilee).

Planning

The planning applications over the last year have mainly been in respect of chalet improvements at Freathy and Tregonhawke where several controversial proposals for chalet re-builds have been lodged. Whilst the Parish Council has generally supported these planning applications, we have objected to some proposals that contravene the Article 4 requirements. Also, we have resolved in future to object to new hot tubs at Freathy, which bring health and safety issues.

Solar Fund

We have continued to receive regular £3000 contributions from British Solar Renewables and are delighted that we have been able to fund local community projects. We are looking at using the fund in 2022 to improve the turning area at the ford.

Environment

We have been active on many issues in the parish in the last year including:

Provision of replacement bus shelter in Freathy. Support for double yellow lines at Tregantle. Design and provision of new Wildlife Information Board at St John Ford.

Undertaken detailed inspection with Cormac resulting in four new areas of asphalting in and around St John, and clearing of ditches.

Removal of redundant telegraph poles in St John

Section 137 Donations

We have received letters of thanks for our £250 donation to Shelterbox (in respect of Ukraine) and £250 donation to Rame Responders.


St John walkers
